 - b. Emergency Preparedness and Public Safety Committee-The Coastal San Pedro NC has appropriated funds for large Emergency Preparedness Kits and radios to help the community be prepared. They have now found four locations to store the items. They are hoping to work with the Neighborhood Teen Program- Gelfand
 - c. Parks and Coastline-update on Walkers Café work is being done at the location which is unpermitted. We are still waiting for the Historical Monument designation. It still has to go to the City's Plum Committee and to the City Council for the final vote. -The people who own the property want to lease it for \$12,000.00 a month. -Gould

11. Motion regarding Best Western, 111 Gaffey, conversion to homeless housing. Planning, Land Use, and Transportation Committee

Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council supports the project at 111 S. Gaffey, the Best Western Motel, which converts the current hotel use to housing for homeless male veterans, and requests that the following items be incorporated as part of the project:

- a. Staff to resident ratio to be a minimum of 1 to 20.
- b. 24-hour security to be provided for the perimeter of the building, including video surveillance at street level.
- c. Any missing street trees along Gaffey Street to be replaced.
- d. More landscaping on the upper terraces and along 1st Street to be provided.
- e. As maintenance of the property is required, building to be painted in a consistent color.
- f. Exterior lighting that is softer and that has illumination throughout the exterior to be re-considered.
- g. The covenant for use as homeless housing to be increased to 55 years.

Planning, Land Use, and Transportation Committee

No Public Comment

Whereas, Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council has previously expressed serious concerns regarding the Sidewalk and Transit Amenities Program (STAP) and about digital signs in particular (see attached letters dated January 18, 2022 and January 27, 2020);

Whereas, the program will involve the collection of individuals' personal data, and the City does not define what data will be collected, which *vendors or* City departments will have access to it, or how it will be used;

Whereas, the program has moved forward for City Council review having been mis-represented to the public and without addressing critical concerns and questions raised during public outreach;

Whereas, the further failure to produce an Environmental Impact Report and perform a full CEQA review is problematic, and the introduction of a new L.A. Municipal Code (LAMC) within the STAP Mitigated Negative Declaration is inappropriate, as there already is a dedicated LAMC to allow for advertising on the public right-of-way for transit shelters;

Whereas, the failure to incorporate any formal avenues for input and consideration from Neighborhood Councils or from the local City Council District Offices on future placement of structures (in this program or in any new programs resulting from the new LAMC) is unacceptable.

Resolved, The Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council strongly opposes the collection of any and all personal data.

Resolved, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council opposes the action of the L.A. City Council *not related to digital signs*. in Council File No. 22-0392 and urges the City Council to question and reject the proposed ordinance to allow digital off-site signs to be displayed on structures that are part of the Transportation Communication Network Program between the City and Metro (Council File No. 21-0600-S110).

Whereas, the City of Los Angeles is considering a "Wildlife District Supplemental Use District and Zone Change", which would create a special "Wildlife District" in the Santa Monica Mountains, in which care-fully considered modifications to zoning and planning requirements (such as setbacks, lot coverage, fencing, lighting, and grading) would be made to preserve wildlife connectivity through private and commercial properties; and

Whereas, it is in the best interest of all City residents to preserve and enhance our irreplaceable and valuable natural heritage;

Therefore, the Coastal San Pedro Neighborhood Council supports the proposed "Wildlife District Supplemental Use District and Zone Change".
